STUDY GUIDE

- 1. When have you most enjoyed a meal with friends or family? What was it like? Why was it enjoyable?
- 2. This weekend we are exploring the meaning of the communion meal, or Lord's Supper. We will look at four different portions of Scripture. Begin your study in prayer, asking God to speak to you through His word, and then begin the study.
- 3. Read Matthew 26:26-30 aloud. In this story of Jesus shares a meal with His followers before His crucifixion. What captures your attention about Jesus, the disciples, and the significance of this meal?
- 4. In 1 Corinthians 11:23-32, the Apostle Paul echoes Jesus' words in a letter to an early church in the city of Corinth. Read that passage and discuss what Paul says about communion.
- 5. How does the communion meal reflect the action of Jesus in the past? What does that mean for us today?
- 6. Now read a longer passage, John 6:25-59. Jesus offers an extended teaching on his sacrificial life and death before it happens. This is a curious and confusing experience for His listeners. What stands out to you about the meaning of Jesus' teaching as we hear it from where we stand today?
- 7. Turn finally to 1 Corinthians 10:14-22. Again, the Apostle Paul describes the communion meal, this time with attention to the relationships of believers one to another. What do you think is most important here for the way we relate as followers of Jesus around the communion table?
- 8. What does communion, or the Lord's Supper, mean to you? What is one way this study of Scripture might make your participation in the meal more meaningful or significant?

TAKE A STEP

Communion is a family meal for those who have given themselves to God through faith in Jesus Christ. At Eastbrook we have an open table, which means all followers of Jesus are welcome to participate with us regardless of church membership. If you are a follower of Jesus, approach the meal remembering Jesus' work, meeting with Him spiritually today, and looking forward to the celebration at the end of all time.

If you are not a follower of Jesus, we want to ask you to consider what is holding you back from taking a step of faith today. Why not surrender your life to Jesus Christ, giving him the opportunity to be your Savior from the penalty of sin and Lord who leads you into God's best for your life?
