



PROCLAIM & EMBODY THE LOVE OF JESUS CHRIST IN THE CITY& IN THE WORLD

Perhaps the most defining moment in the history of the church of Jesus Christ arrives during the Jewish festival of Pentecost as recorded in Acts 2. While Jesus' disciples gather to pray after His ascension, there is a sudden, mighty move of the Holy Spirit manifested in a rushing wind and what looked like tongues of fire resting upon those gathered. Moving out from that gathering, the disciples proclaim the message of Jesus in varied languages understandable to all who have gathered in Jerusalem from around the known world for the festival. After Peter preaches, we're told huge numbers from that wide-ranging crowd became disciples of Jesus that day.

Thus begins something utterly new. If the church is anything, it is a Holy Spirit-infused community gathered around Jesus for the glory of God the Father. And perhaps most noticeable from a human standpoint is that this new community consists of people from various backgrounds who are formed into one new community of faith in Jesus. This image is echoed in Revelation, the final book of the Bible:

After this I looked, and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands. And they cried out in a loud voice: "Salvation belongs to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb." (Revelation 7:9-10)

At Eastbrook we describe this as "Becoming 7." By God's grace and in the power of the Holy Spirit, we want to live as a snapshot here in Milwaukee of that heavenly reality of the church. We have so many ways to grow into this and also so much to celebrate in this.

Every year at Eastbrook our annual meeting offers a focused opportunity to remember who we are, celebrate what God has done in the past, and also anticipate what God will do in the future. We want to proclaim and embody the love of Jesus Christ in the city and in the world. Living as a church that is becoming 7, we want to grow disciples, reach out, multiply leaders, and live together as a church that is fully engaged.

Take 15 minutes to prayerfully look over this annual report. As you read, I hope, like me, you are moved to thank and praise God for all He is doing in our midst as a church, and also ask God to continue to lead us as a church in the coming year. I am always so thankful for all who serve so faithfully and give so sacrificially. If you haven't somehow joined in with what God is doing at Eastbrook, I want to encourage you not to miss the chance to step forward in some way this coming year.

Let's celebrate and let's move together into a new ministry year!

This artwork also serves as a reminder of the wonderful opportunity we have now to join together, beholding our Maker and loving one another.

You will also notice the depiction of the Trinity: the almighty Father on the Throne, the beloved Son as the Lamb in His arms and the Holy Spirit represented by seven doves.

I chose to highlight the theme of Man's tyranny versus Jesus' reign through the depiction of the dismantled bricks and the stonework. The bricks represent manipulative conformity for the sake of control and efficiency. Whereas the stones represent the beauty of diversity and Jesus' perfect leadership of an international community with an intimate relationship with every individual.


Our main focus this past year was to press RESET after the pandemic, calling the church back to gathering in person.

We saw 61 PEOPLE sign up for groups for the first time, as all 37 of our Small Groups, 10 Adult Classes,

Women's, Men's & Student Bible Studies dug into the RESET curriculum based on Hebrews 10:24-25.

This past year, 170 PEOPLE attended 3

week in our Small Groups.





Last year, we had 12 SIXTH

our Main Lobby during the winter!

The Eastbrook Food Pantry is located in the west parking lot of our campus and serves the **53209** Zip Code. This past year, we served **757 HOUSEHOLDS** which represents **584 PEOPLE** per month. As a part of our care for our guests, we gave away **200 BIBLES** to our quests and prayed with many more.

Last year, the Bread of Healing Clinic at Eastbrook Church saw 172

UNIQUE PATIENTS, had
638 PATIENT APPOINTMENTS, and distributed 2640
PRESCRIPTIONS to our
uninsured clients.

The updates in the Bread of Healing clinic space and medication room have enabled us to improve the quality, safety and confidentiality of the care we provide to individuals in our community as well as revamp the flow for volunteers to easily step into the clinic in their areas of expertise to serve.

through the diversity of their student body, representing

19 CITIES and 33 ZIP CODES. Not all students come from a faith-based or Christian background, 77% of last year's students identify as a racial or ethnic minority and 22% are first or second generation born in the United States. We were also recognized by Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI) as a TOP PERFORMER in closing the achievement gap.



We evangelistically distributed a record **903 BOXES**OF LOVE to families all across the city of Milwaukee.

10 MIDDLE SCHOOLERS and
4 PARENTS served 4-6 SATURDAY
AFTERNOONS this past year at Hope Street
Ministries as a part of their Serve Saturday initiative.

The Hymn Ensemble had 5 **OUTINGS** and took hope and community to 19 **PEOPLE**, singing hymns and distributing communion elements (plus a good number of others listening in at care facilities!)

Each Friday night, we hosted an average of 25 INTER-NATIONAL STUDENTS at an weekly dinner.

The TOUR OF MILITARY welcomed 110

NEW INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS to the city from 24 DIFFERENT NATIONS.

75 PEOPLE helped drive, navigate, and help, while
11 EASTBROOK FAMILIES hosted dinners for our new friends at the end of the Tour.

Last year, we continued to love and support Afghan refugees through the Afghan Student Partnership of Milwaukee (ASPOM) —a partnership among Eastbrook Church, the English Language Academy at UWM, and others in Milwaukee.

The International Community Center (ICC) on Milwaukee's South Side had 213 NEW STUDENTS from 27 NATIONS. This past year, we averaged 35 STUDENTS EACH DAY, learning English, taking citizenship classes, and participating in tutoring.

NEW THIS YEAR! Eastbrook member Sue Gilliland and her team put together a new room for kids at the ICC. This room provides care and instruction for kids whose parents would not otherwise be able to take English and citizenship classes at the ICC due to childcare needs.

This past year, we have seen doorways into long-term relationships open up. Our members have welcomed Afghan and Ukrainian refugees, deepened friendships with Rohingyas on the southside, hosted international students, and cared for those struggling in poverty. Through these relationships, God is bearing fruit in the lives of those we reach out to, and we look forward to what He has in store as we invite more people into these relationships in the coming year.

LEADERSHIP GROWTH REMAINED A PRIORITY LAST YEAR AS WE CONTINUED OUR MINISTRY RESIDENCY PROGRAM, SUMMER INTERNSHIP PROGRAM, AND INVESTED IN GROWTH IN MINISTRY LEADERS CHURCH-WIDE.

This was the 8TH YEAR of our Ministry Residency
Program. we had 2 YEAR-LONG MINISTRY
RESIDENTS serving in the areas of adults/care and
worship. TESSICA and SHELBY spent 3,120
COMBINED HOURS developing their calling,
character and competency through their connection and
contribution to Eastbrook Church. They each read
approximately 650 PAGES of theology and ministry
readings for monthly ministry training and equipping sessions.

HOW IT WORKS: Each Ministry Resident is assigned a staff supervisor in their area of ministry, as well as a pastoral mentor in a different ministry area. They have ministry responsibilities, frequent training and equipping meetings, where they are taught by experts and do graduate-level studies. Ministry resident positions are full-time, one-year commitments.

Even during my relatively short stay as an Eastbrook intern over the summer, I can safely say that I have been able to serve and grow in a plethora of ways. It has been a genuine blessing to be able to witness the working of the Holy Spirit throughout the many ministries of Eastbrook. In the same way, it has also been such a generous gift to be able to learn alongside many servant-hearted leaders as we get thrown headlong into the troubles of the world together. I am confident that I will be reaping the benefits of this wonderful opportunity for many seasons to come!

The past four years in particular have been a season of growth and development as the Academy continues to refine its vision, grow disciples, and multiply leaders. Over the last 4 years, we celebrate a 100% COLLEGE ACCEPTANCE RATE, average ACT scores of 24, and an average of \$33,000 in scholarships! Our enrollment continues to grow as well:



We continue to invest in Christian educators as well through Eastbrook Academy. Since 2020, we have increased our staff by 40%, increased staff diversity by 100%, and 10% of our current staff are former Eastbrook Academy students!

This past ministry year, we were blessed to have **3 INTERNS** from Wheaton College (Illinois), Lindenwood University (Missouri), and Multnomah University (Oregon). **AMBER. CAPE**, and **TY** and served in Student, NextGen, and Adult Ministries all summer long!

63 WORSHIP LEADERS helped lead our congregation in worship at 159 WEEKEND WORSHIP SERVICES and 9 2ND TUESDAYS: WORSHIP & PRAYER NIGHTS during the last year. The top 5 songs we sung this year were NO GREATER LOVE, KING OF GLORY, NO one, onise in and king of kings.

Leading worship is all about engaging with God and each other. It's really beautiful to witness students in our church glorify God with the gifts that He's given them.

THIS PAST MINISTRY YEAR WAS ONE OF OUR MOST GENEROUS YEARS AS A CHURCH. WE SAW OUR HIGHEST MISSIONS RELIEF OFFERINGS AND RECORD LEVELS OF GENEROSITY THROUGH SERVICE AND GIVING. WE ALSO SOUGHT TO RE-ENGAGE POST-PANDEMIC WITH OUR "RESET" SERIES & NEW GROUPS.

Our weekly in-person worship service attendance average was 1022 plus 94 kids in Sunday School, and 38 kids in Kids' Choirs each Sunday. This represents a 36.9% INCREASE from last year and a 143.3% INCREASE from the 2021-2022 ministry year. Our highest attendance was **1564 PEOPLE** on Easter Sunday.



EASTBROOK AT HOME

continues to be a space for people around the world to tune into our services. An average of 316 VIEWERS logged in each week to stream our services through the Eastbrook App and Church Online Platform. Our online hosts prayed with 69

PEOPLE and 1 COMMITTED THEIR LIFE TO CHRIST for the first time last November.

Together with Elizabeth Hacker, I have the privilege of hosting Eastbrook Online. What a sweet calling. We may never see the faces of some of these members of our Eastbrook Church family, but we pray, and are confident God is ministering to each of them in their unique situations.


